Realising Exhibition on Winning Designs of Architectural Competition
Special exhibition “Dialogues – Photographs by H el ene Binet” extended – New annual

BERLIN, 6 July 2015 – As a result of the latest developments, the Bauhaus-Archiv / Museum f ur Gestaltung is altering its programme. The current special exhibition “Dialogues – Photographs by H el ene Binet” will be extended until 26 October 2015 on account of the great interest among visitors. From 2 December 2015, a special exhibition will present the winning designs of the architectural competition currently being carried out for the new museum building. The exhibition “Mies Revisited: Haus Werner, Berlin, 1913”, which was planned for 2015, will be postponed for a year.

Exhibition programme 2015:

3 June – 26 Oct 2015: DIALOGUES – Photographs by H el ene Binet (extended for 5 weeks)

For over 25 years now, the photographer H el ene Binet has been using her camera to capture the architectural work of internationally known architects, such as John Hejduk, Ludwig Leo, Le Corbusier, Peter Zumthor and Zaha Hadid. In her photographs Binet shows structures and material, forms and geometries in such a way that something entirely independent emerges, something that goes far beyond a pure reproduction of the buildings.

2 Dec 2015 – 29 Feb 2016: MOVING FORWARD – The Winning Designs for the New Bauhaus - Archiv

In 2019, on the occasion of the 100th anniversary of the founding of the Bauhaus, the Bauhaus-Archiv / Museum f ur Gestaltung designed by Bauhaus founder Walter Gropius will be modernised and supplemented by a new museum building. The exhibition “MOVING FORWARD – The Winning Designs for the New Bauhaus-Archiv” will present the winning design selected at the end of October of 2015 and additional designs placing in the architectural competition.
