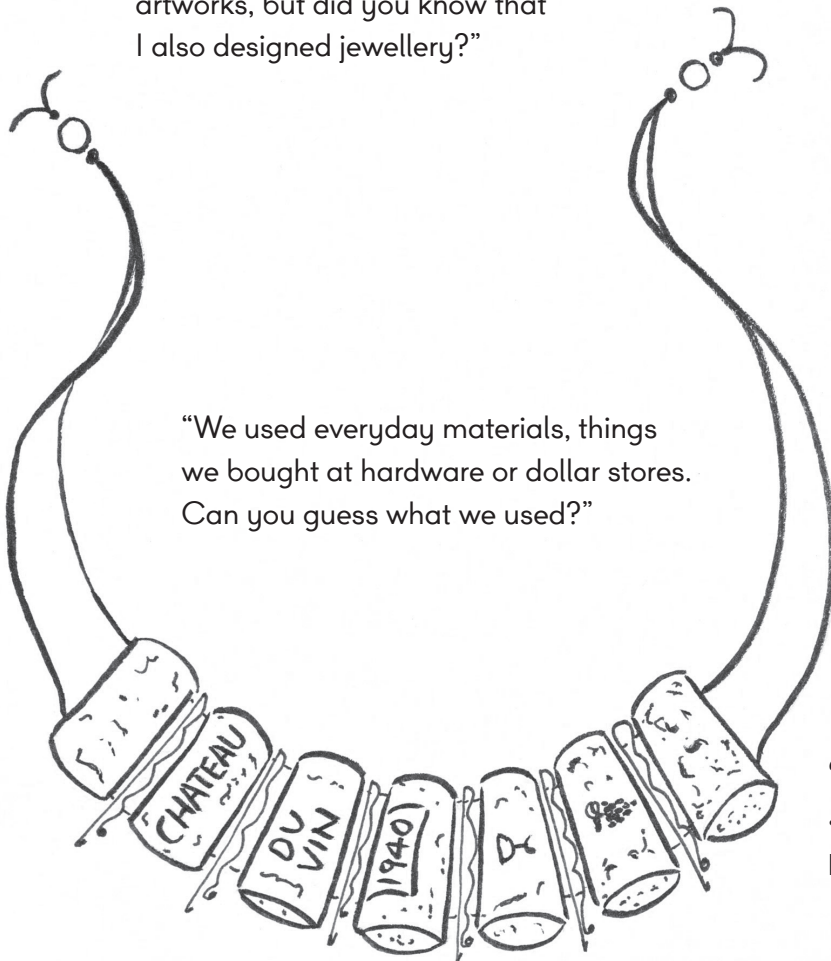


“Hey!

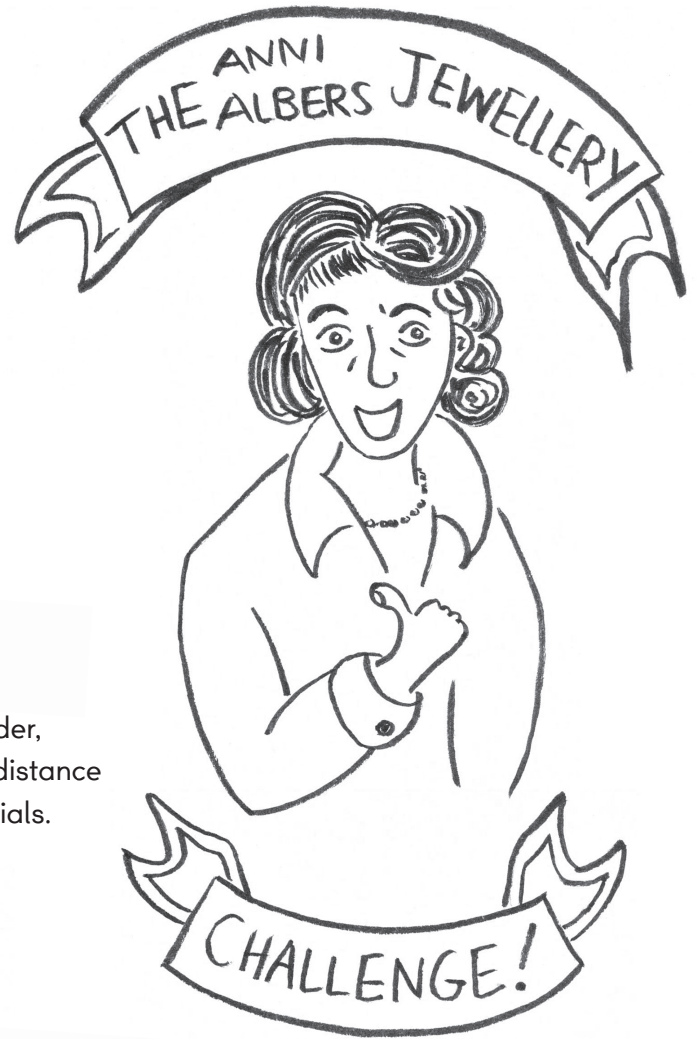

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① COLLECT

③ SORT

repetition and distance

Corks can be cut in slices or lengthways.
Make holes in them with a screwdriver.
Open up paper clips; bend them into
different shapes.
